**FSMA tabbed as Naval Honor School**

CLAYTON — According to senior Zane Hampton, First State Military Academy is a great school to attend — evidenced by where cadets can go after graduating.

"It provides a lot of paths moving forward, whether it's colleges, universities or the military itself," said the Middletown resident and battalion sergeant major, second in charge among the students.

"There's a lot that this school provides, which I think is one of the main reasons it's very good, but it also provides a very strong cadet family within the battalion," he continued. "So, you have staff leadership, where you're constantly working, constantly planning, so you get close to the people you work with."

Zane's appraisal was recently confirmed when the academy was selected as a Naval Honor School for the seventh year by the Marine Corps Junior ROTC headquarters in Quantico, Virginia. The distinction means that FSMA's Junior ROTC was deemed to be in the top 20% of 62 programs in the mid-Atlantic and Northeast, according to a news release from First State.

The selection is based on several criteria from the previous school year, including inspection results, the number of cadets, the amount of community service, the number of public affairs events attended by cadets, the academic awards presented to students and the total awarded for scholarships and entitlements.

**Officials tout EV-charging stations**

Goal: Drivers no more than 25 miles from a site

DOVER — Optimism abounded Friday, as officials outlined plans to support Delaware's electric vehicle infrastructure bill.

With \$17.5 million from the federal government and \$4 million from the bond bill, installations of 11 electric vehicle-charging stations is planned throughout the state, starting next year.

A network is on the way along the major corridors of U.S. 13, U.S. 113, Del. 1 and Interstate 95, according to a news release from Gov. John Carney's office.

Friday, at a news conference hosted by the Delaware Department of Transportation, state leaders emphasized the value of being part of the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Formula Program, which brought the federal funding.

Stephanie Johnson, the depart-
