DBCC helped author **(HS 1 for HB 60 w/ HA 1)** which requires Delaware insurers to cover diagnostic breast exams required after a mammogram.

Francesca Vogel, DBCC CEO, testified in support of DE HB 253, a bill sponsored by Representative Kim Williams, which removed the barrier of needing a script to be screened for breast cancer.

Detection & Early Intervention

1,119: Women assisted with getting a mammogram.

1,183: Women provided with navigation services to obtain a mammogram.



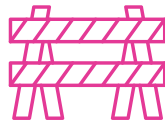
Comprehensive Survivor Support

2,594: Total breast cancer survivors provided with support and resources.

177: Newly diagnosed women provided with one-on-one support.

334: Survivor program activities and events hosted.

14: Survivors trained and certified as DBCC Peer Mentors.

294: Women provided with transportation to screenings or follow-up appointments.

343: Patients provided with interpretation during screenings or follow-up appointments.



Community Health & Prevention

1,100: Participants engaged in the Yes2Health program at no cost.

128: Free Yes2Health classes offered across the state of Delaware.

6,408: People reached through community events and breast health presentations
